REFORMING KY'S JUVENILE JUSTICE SYSTEM

KYA'S STORY OF IMPACTING POLICY CHANGE OVER TIME

Worked with Department of Juvenile Justice, the courts, and advocates to re-establish data points on juvenile justice in our KIDS COUNT project.

2006

Attempts were made at reform but the issue was complicated and many stakeholders couldn't agree on a solution.

Co-Chairs Sen. Whitney Westerfield and Rep. John Tilley led the 2nd vear of a taskforce on juvenile justice.

2013

State brought in Pew Charitable Trusts as a national expert & involved multiple stakeholders to develop recommendations for reform.

A strong juvenile justice reform bill was filed during the 2014 legislative

2014

Weeks of negotiations occurred for all groups to come to agreement.



FUND KIDS FIRST RALLY

Spoke out for two Blueprint priorities including restored funding to the Child Care Assistance and Kinship Care Programs and asked state leaders to "Fund Kids First" on the next two-year budget plan. Several speakers at the rally either received help from the child care and kinship care programs or were directly impacted by the cuts.

STEP UP FOR KIDS REGIONAL CONFERENCES

Raised awareness and built support for important children's issues. Events were held in Owensboro, Manchester, and Northern Kentucky. Over 250 attended in total. Key speakers included Representative Tommy Thompson, Senator Joe Bowen, Judge Lisa Jones, Senate President Robert Stivers, and Judge Karen Thomas.

Urged legislators to fund kids first in the next two year state budget and support the Blueprint for Kentucky's Children agenda. Challenged the Governor and legislators to band together and provide solutions that are good for families and for the state budget.
