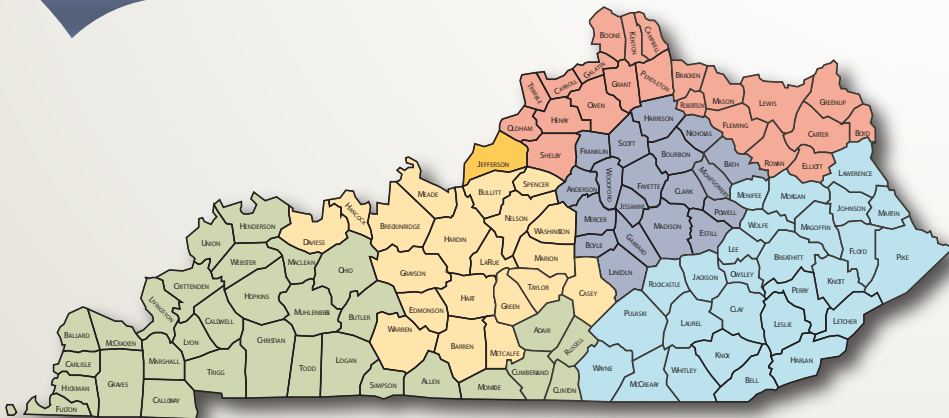

Kentucky leads the nation in the decrease in uninsured, dropping from 14.3% in 2013 down to 8.5% in 2014. A healthy workforce is more productive and leads to a stronger state economy, more jobs and more local spending.
